What is going on?

October 2011 – Commission adopted the <u>new legislative</u> <u>framework</u> for 2014-2020

On-going - <u>negotiations</u> with the Council and the European Parliament

<u>Multiannual Financing Framework</u> (Budget) adopted by the Council on 8 February 2013

Rejection by the European Parliament on 13 March 2013

EP plenary vote in October 2013, entry into force - end of November 2013





Legislative package

General regulation

Common provisions for cohesion policy, the rural development policy and the maritime and fisheries policies

Common provisions for cohesion policy only (ERDF, ESF, CF)

Fund-specific regulations for ERDF, ESF, CF **Specific ETC regulation EGTC regulation**





A menu of thematic objectives...

- Research & innovation
- Information and communication technologies (ICT)
- Competitiveness of Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs)
- Shift towards a low-carbon economy
- Climate change adaptation & risk prevention and management
- Environmental protection & resource efficiency
- Sustainable transport & removing bottlenecks in key network infrastructures
- Employment & supporting labour mobility
- Social inclusion & combating poverty
- Education, skills & lifelong learning
- Institutional capacity building & efficient public administrations





...and investment priorities

Each thematic objective is translated into "investment priorities" (in Fund-specific regulations)

For ETC: Art.5 of the draft ERDF regulation + Art.6 of the draft ETC regulation

Flexibility for a programme to choose an optimal mix of them





State of play of negotiations on ETC regulation

- Political agreement reached on the whole ETC Regulation (except for financial allocations) and COREPER endorsed corresponding texts on 26 June 2013
- ETC template discussed in expert group on 1 March, 24 May and 4 July 2013





What's new? Objectives of the CBC

Cross-border cooperation should:

- •Tackle <u>common challenges</u> identified jointly in the border regions
- Exploit the untapped potentials in the border area





What's new? **Programme areas**

- COM will adopt implementing act on <u>cross-border</u> areas to receive support, broken down by cooperation programme
- Possibility to request inclusion of <u>additional areas</u> when programmes are submitted





What's new? Content of cooperation programmes

- Structure aligned to OPs under Investment for Growth and Jobs Goal
- Not all elements will be covered by COM decision
- Confirmation of the agreement to the programming document in writing






What's new? Focus of programmes

- Thematic concentration: At least 80% of the ERDF allocation to be concentrated on up to 4 thematic objectives
- Priority axis should correspond to <u>one thematic</u> <u>objective</u> and comprise <u>one or more investment</u> <u>priorities</u> from that thematic objective
- Possibility to <u>exceptionally combine</u> <u>complementary investment priorities</u> from different thematic objectives








What's new? Basic questions

- Why do we need this money?
- What do we want to achieve?
- How to do it?
- How to measure it?
- Result indicators, common output indicators, specific output indicators







Investment priority

Enhancing regional mobility through connecting secondary and tertiary nodes to TEN-T infrastructure

Specific objective: Enhancing mobility between small towns and big cities and towards international border crossing points



Reduction of travel time

Description of actions needed

- •Enhancing the capacity of roads A and B
- •Building multi-level intersections in areas x and y
- •Connecting railway track A to track B

Categories of intervention

- •Railways
- •Secondary road links to TEN-T road network and nodes
- •Other national and regional roads



- •Km of road upgraded
- •Km of new railway line

•No of intersections constructed





What's new? Operations and beneficiaries

- <u>Cooperation criteria:</u> 2 +1 (Cooperation in <u>development and implementation</u> obligatory, in addition cooperation in either the <u>financing or the staffing</u>)
- Lead beneficiaries may be in <u>third countries</u>, subject to certain conditions
- Specific rules for operations implemented outside the <u>Union part of the programme area</u> (both inside and outside the EU)





What's new? Reporting, Technical Assistance

- Regular implementation <u>reports</u> to be submitted by <u>31 May</u>, (except for more strategic ones in 2017 and 2019, for which the deadline is 30 June)
- TA: 6% of total amount allocated to a cooperation programme
- For programmes with a total allocation not exceeding <u>EUR 50m</u>, the amount of the total ERDF allocated to TA is limited to 7% of the total amount allocated, but not less than EUR 1.5m and not higher than EUR 3m.



What's new? Eligibility


- Hierarchy of rules: CPR and delegated act, additional rules agreed by Member States in the monitoring committee, national rules apply as a last resort
- COM to adopt delegated <u>act on a number of cost</u> <u>categories</u>
- Staff costs may be calculated as a flat rate of up to 20% of the direct costs of an operation other than staff costs



Use of the Euro and de-commitment

- Three options for the conversion into Euro
- N+3







Budget

MFF for ETC: € 8.948 billion:

 \triangleright (a) € 6.6 billion for cross-border cooperation (currently € 5.6 billion for 53 programmes)

This is equivalent to 2.75% of cohesion policy resources.

The COM had proposed a higher share for ETC (€ 11.7 billion, 3.5 % of cohesion policy resources).



Programmes - what is the issue?

- Current programmes are often just <u>designed to spend</u>:
 - Objectives vague (often deliberately so for maximum freedom)
 - ➤ How to recognise <u>success or failure often not clear</u>
 - Evaluations focused on <u>bottlenecks to implementation</u> mostly linked to spending - not effects
 - ➤ <u>Indicators do not express objectives</u> & reporting is not reliable in some cases (and is never debated)
- Consequently, it has been difficult to demonstrate the impact of the policy
