The INTERACT programme coordinates European Cooperation Day. INTERACT provides practical support, training and advice to European Territorial Cooperation programmes. INTERACT is co-financed by the European Regional Development Fund.

What is European Territorial Cooperation anyways?

European Territorial Cooperation is a tool of the European Union (EU) that brings people together, across borders, in order to solve common issues that cannot be easily managed within a single country. By pulling together knowledge and resources, European Territorial Cooperation helps strengthen transportation, healthcare, environmental protection, education, local economies and so much more. A similar tool is used by the EU with neighbouring countries, strengthening cooperation even further.

Tackling unemployment and increasing social inclusion: Renovating industrial spaces to be used for skills training, and as shared work spaces for people on both sides of the border.



Healthcare: Medical experts from across regions working together to develop a tele-medicine system that allows doctors to reach patients in rural areas more easily.
